Dear Parents/ Carers,

Reading at Home

With the start of a new academic year, we wanted to clarify with you, the arrangements for children reading at home. At Rakegate, we ask that you listen to your child read at least 3 times a week. For children in EYFS and KS1, you should note the pages you have read with them and make any comments on how they did or difficulties they may have had with particular words or understanding. This is to be completed online via our Boom Reader app. Please speak to your child's teacher if you need a log in for this. In KS2, it is important that you also encourage the children to write their own comments, on the pupil section of the app, about what they have read.

EYFS

In EYFS, children will be sent home with a book that matches their phonic ability. To begin with, this will be a book with no words to begin with so that you can share and talk about the pictures with your child. Children should have their book bags in school every day with them as they will be heard read once a week by an adult. Comments will be logged on Boom Reader. Books will be changed once a week. Any reading completed at home, should be logged on Boom Reader and any problems or questions about the book can be communicated via the app or through the class teacher.

KS1 (Years 1-2)


Children will be sent home with a copy of the RWI book that they have been reading in their group that week and an RWI reading book which matches their ability group within phonics. In year 2, once your child has completed the RWI scheme, they will no longer take home a book for this but will be given a Big Cat Collins reading book (colour coded based on their reading age and ability). Once your child has read their books at home with you and this has been logged, children can bring the book back into school and it be given to a member of staff for them to change. We aim to change the books once a week.

KS2 (Years 3-6)

Children will be sent home with a Big Cat Collins Reading book (colour coded based on their reading age and ability). Once they have reached the end of this scheme, they will be a free reader and will choose a book from the class reading corner or a book from home which is appropriate for their age and ability. In KS2, it is the children's responsibility to speak to a member of staff and change their book when they have finished it. This may take longer than a week as the length of the text increases.

Reading is an essential skill for success in the future. We will continue to teach reading skills and develop a love for reading daily however we would like to ask for your support in this. At home, when reading with your child, it would be helpful if you could discuss the text in detail and question them about what they have read. This will help towards improving their understanding.

If reading three times a week, this doesn't mean your child has to read 3 different books. Please take your time with each book and make sure they really understand what they have read. The book your child brings home has been carefully selected to match their reading ability; there is no rush to read the whole book and change it the next day.
