Choose at least one English task, one maths task and one topic/science task from the table below. The tasks are ranked accordingly, from 1 star being the easiest level to 3 stars being the hardest. You can choose which level you complete. If you wish to, you could complete more than three tasks.

	Draw a picture of your favourite character from a traditional story. Describe what that character is like. Use some powerful adjectives!	Measure the length of the feet of the people in your family in centimetres. Order them and record their names from the smallest to the biggest foot. Has the tallest person got the biggest feet?	Choose 3 objects and draw them. Describe the material that each object is made from. Say why it is a good material to use.
	Read the story of Goldilocks and the Three Bears. Imagine that Baby Bear forgave Goldilocks and they became friends. Make up a new story about them.	Using any combination of 2p and 10p coins, how many different ways can you make 20p? Draw them in your book. Which way uses the least coins and the most coins?	Make a map or a 3D model of your garden, street or part of your local area. Label it.
	Do some research about brown bears and write a report about them. Use a heading and sub-headings to organise the information.	See how many different calculations you can make with an answer of 20. You can use addition, subtraction, multiplication and division.	Find out more about an important building, statue or monument in the local area. It can be an old or new building. What makes it significant? Present your findings in an imaginative way.
